Associate Dean for Global Engagement

The Ira A. Fulton Schools of Engineering (FSE) seeks an Associate Dean for Global Engagement to provide leadership in advancing the schools' global objectives, facilitating international collaborations, and providing opportunities for students and faculty to engage with the global community. The position will be responsible for overseeing and coordinating the international initiatives and programs within the Fulton Schools. The Associate Dean reports to the Vice Dean of Academic and Student Affairs. This is a half-time, fiscal year, administrative appointment with a preferred start date of October 15, 2023. This position is open to FSE faculty only.

Position Description

The Associate Dean for Global Engagement has a portfolio that includes global engagement, programs, and initiatives that advance Fulton Schools' goals. We seek an individual who can:

- Lead FSE's engagement with PluS Alliance, TEDI London, and the ASU Cintana Alliance to increase access to engineering education on an international scale.
- Develop and implement the strategic vision for global initiatives and programs and identify opportunities for international collaborations and partnerships.
- Establish and maintain relationships with partner institutions, fostering collaboration in the areas of joint degree programs, research, student and faculty exchanges, and study abroad programs.
- Explore opportunities for academic cooperation and collaborative initiatives with international delegations and partners.
- Support quality control related to the delivery of programs with international partners to ensure students are meeting learning outcomes, including for accredited programs.
- Explore opportunities for FSE students to engage in global challenges and competitions.
- Identify appropriate global competencies for FSE students and approaches for developing these competencies via curricular and extra-curricular approaches.
- Oversee study abroad and exchange programs, ensuring that they align with academic objectives and are in compliance with university policies and procedures.
- In collaboration with the FSE Office of Research, Innovation and Entrepreneurship, support the administration of sponsored projects for global initiatives.
- Support global student recruitment activities as appropriate.
- Serve as the representative of FSE's global engagement and programs, both internally and externally. This includes participating in university-level committees, conferences, and professional organizations and fostering relationships with stakeholders.
- International travel will be required.

Required Qualifications

- Current faculty in the Ira A. Fulton Schools of Engineering.
- Strong communication skills and able to present ideas effectively, and to listen.
- Demonstrated commitment to global initiatives and engagement in education and research.

- A record of service and/or scholarly work advancing global initiatives and programs.
- A demonstrated ability to collaborate with leadership, faculty, staff, and students from all backgrounds.
- Knowledge of university policies and procedures.

Desired Qualifications

- Successful experience in developing and implementing global programs and initiatives.
- Demonstrated ability to build consensus and cultivate collaborative teams.
- Experience with meeting and reporting on accreditation requirements.
- Knowledge of current global issues and trends in higher education and engineering.
- Ability to work effectively in teams composed of faculty, staff, and students.
- Demonstrated ability to analyze data and make effective decisions.
